GINNYGIN set the pace from the start, held a clear lead while saving ground throughout, then finished under urging. READ RICHIES NOTES was never far back, raced along the three path on the last turn, then made a late bid to finish well. CELEBRATING SARAH pressed the pace from the start, saved ground through the far turn, then weakened late. FULL QUEEN was slow early, raced along the three path through the last turn, then found her best stride late. DOADEERAFEMALEDEER lacked speed, raced along the two path on the second turn and showed little. STEP SISTER raced along the inside on the second turn, lacked a rally then was pulled up after the raced and vanned off. BABY PULPIT was void of early speed, saved ground through the far turn, then lacked a late rally and was outrun. OUTRAGEOUS SADIE pressed the early pace, raced two wide on the far turn, then flattened out and was eased to the wire.
