UNCLE CAESAR pressed the pace and made a two wide bid in hand to go on even terms for command by the quarter pole, then took over leaving the turn and was sent down and put to left handed crop urging and then vigorous handling and one more pop left handed with the crop and widened under strong handling to the wire to prove much the best, sharp. POINT DUME set a pressured pace on the inside after being hustled to get there into the first turn, then was headed and dueled for command nearing the quarter pole, relented the lead leaving the turn and could not stay with the winner while keeping on to be clearly second best. FIRST GLIMPSE stalked the pace three wide but offered no bid and weakened in the drive while staying on for the show award. MY REDEMPTION was allowed to settle along the inside and angled out in the lane but offered no rally. B DAWK was off a step slow, then chased the pace three to four wide and tired on the far turn.
